

The Lethbridge and District Horticulture Society looks after two gardens northwest of Henderson Lake. The Heritage garden was originally established in early in



1970. It has a Landscape Rock Plaque identification. The Communities in Bloom site west on the pathway is identified with a CIB Arch and an Ambassador recognition Rock. Both of these gardens are located along the pathway east of the tennis courts.

Since the spring of 2022, regular volunteers with varying hours have tended these gardens. Total March through July volunteer time totalled

close to 300 hours. Volunteers are Jeff Gardiner, Shannon McKay, Martha Nance, Adam Morstad, Rhondda Schindeler, Doug Schindeler and Joyce and Rick Ross.

Rhondda Schindeler, a with the Horticulture Society director, says the goal this year was to improve the soil and relocate some plants in both gardens.
